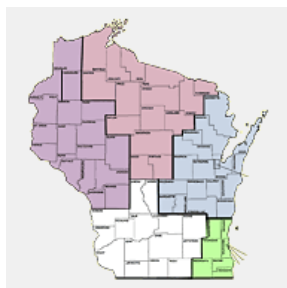
### What is WWA?
